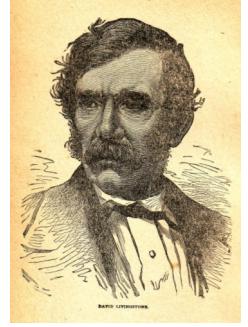


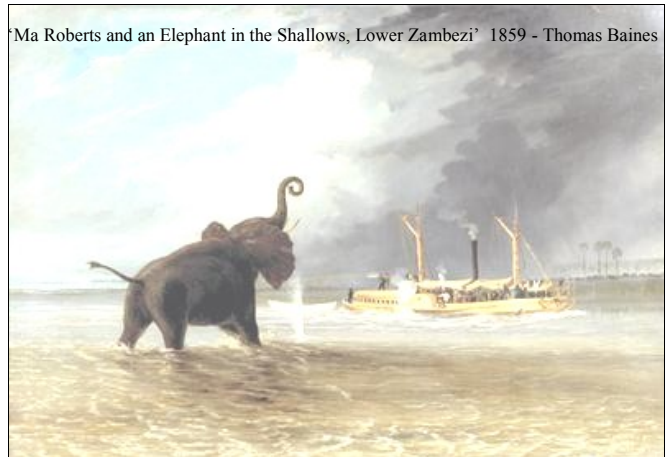
TREASURES ON THE DEEP
