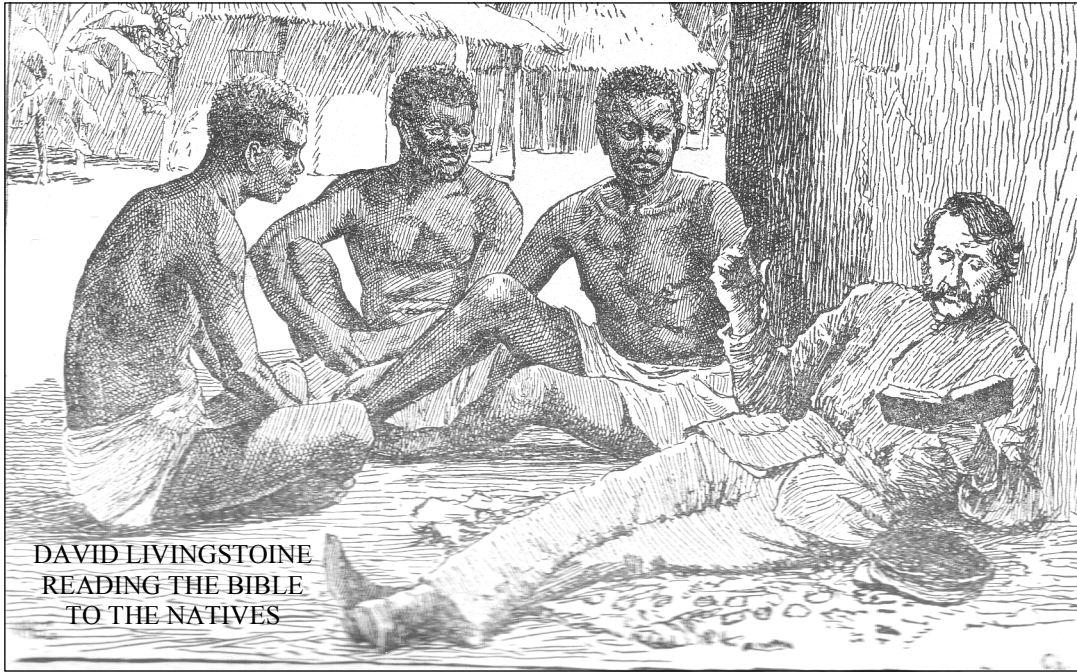

8. Livingstone wanted money to continue his work. The Government offered him the position of British Consul in Central Africa, but said the position came with no pay and no pension! The Geographical Society offered to pay him to do exploration work. Livingstone accepted and left for Africa.
